#### Coogee Precinct Meeting – January 2014

Thank you for the minutes of this meeting of the Coogee Precinct. The Council notes the contents of these minutes and I am able to provide you with the following information in response to resolutions of the meeting.

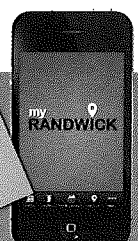
**Resolution 1/14:** In light of the recent events in Goldstein Reserve, the Precinct requests that Council consider a ban on the consumption of alcohol in beachside reserves and parks in the Randwick LGA similar to the Waverley and Manly LGAs to ensure public safety.

**Resolution 2/14:** To protect our seaside coastal environment the Precinct once again requests that Council make all beaches in Randwick smoke free zones similar to Waverley.

I have referred both these resolutions (1/14 and 2/14) to Council's Director, Technical Services and the Coordinator, Open Space Assets. I will forward any information I receive from them regarding both these issues to the precinct.

**Resolution 3/14:** The Precinct requests that the colour of the fence be changed because the colour chosen is dangerous at night because the spearheads cannot be seen (re - Fishing Club at Coogee Beach).

I have forwarded this resolution regarding the colour of the new fencing around the Fishing Club at Coogee to Council's Coordinator, Open Space Assets, and I will contact you when I receive her response.



**Resolution 5/14:** The Precinct requests that the Council have the appropriate officers to ensure that Grant Reserve is cleared of rubbish, and maintained adequately and regularly including along Beach Street. (following reports of garbage remaining in Grant Reserve including along the Beach Street frontage).

I have discussed this resolution with the Manager, Waste and Cleaning Services, and he informed me that Council staff check the area and remove any rubbish from Grant Reserve, and along Beach Street up to Neptune Street, on a daily basis. Service levels are also increased over the busy summer months.

Depending on how many cars are parked along Beach Street, access to rubbish that has accumulated under cars, or in the gutters can be impeded.

In addition, Council's Public Place Officers also regularly patrol the area, usually three times per week. They report problems and lodge service requests for matters requiring attention, including graffiti and dumped rubbish, as well as defects on items including barbecues.

**Resolution 6/14:** The Precinct requests that should the DA be approved it be done so with no openable bi-fold windows, no outdoor dining on Kurrawa Ave (which is a residential street), trading be limited to 6.00pm as suits a cafe, any liquor licence be ruled out and that all garbage collection and deliveries take place in Carr St. (regarding proposed change of use from shop to cafe at 4/52-56 Carr Street; DA lodged 23/12/13).

I have passed the Precinct's comments regarding this Development Application to the Manager, Development Assessment, and requested that he also provide any relevant information regarding the progress of the DA for 4/52-56 Carr Street Coogee. I will pass this information on to you when I receive it.
