Coogee Precinct Meeting 18 February 2013

Thank you for the minutes of this meeting of the Coogee Precinct. The Council notes the contents of these minutes and I am able to provide you with the following information in response to resolutions of the meeting.

Resolution 5/13

Council thanks the Precinct for their comments that have been noted. The development application for the National Memorial for Fallen Life Savers at Coogee will be lodged on Friday 15 March 2013. The development proposal will be publicly advertised and the Precinct can make a submission at that stage. All submissions will be addressed by an independent planner and submitted in a report to Council for consideration.

This project is a Council project for a national memorial and not a Coogee Surf Club project. A Trust has been established to oversee the project and to monitor its development. The Trust consists of:

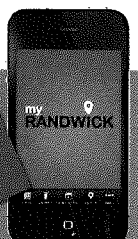

Resolution 4/13

In response to an email from Ms Jennifer Herron on behalf of the Coogee Precinct, Council's Health Building and Regulatory Services advised the following on 20 February 2013:



Dear Jennifer Herron,

Reference is made to your correspondence received on 14 February 2013, regarding the cleaning of Wylies Baths with chlorine and the incident which occurred on 31 December 2012.

The Wylies Bath Trust is the body responsible for the day to day management, care and control, and everyday operations of the baths. Randwick City Council is the appropriate regulatory authority in this matter, as such I advise that Councils Coordinator Environmental Health investigated this serious incident with the management at Wylies Bath Trust.

The management at Wylies Bath Trust were extremely remorseful of the incident, as a result Council issued a written direction to outline their new pool cleaning procedures and to ensure the procedures are conducted in an environmentally safe manner without the use of chlorine. The Trust were also issued a warning that the appropriate regulatory actions will be taken should future offences occur.

Randwick City Council officers attended a meeting with representatives of the Wylies Bath Trust on the 9 January 2013 as part of the investigation. Discussions were held in regards to the new pool cleaning procedures and to ensure future activities are conducted in an environmentally satisfactory manner. It was agreed that the Trust would trial the high pressure cleaning system in place of chlorine.

Council reiterated to the Trust that chlorine is not used to clean any of the coastal pools it is responsible for, and instead the general adopted practice is to use a hot water high pressure cleaning system.

The Trust are fully aware of their environmental obligations and consequences should any future breaches occur. To date, Council is currently assisting with the high pressure cleaning of Wylies Baths.

Randwick City Council is committed to safe maintenance practices which do not harm our local wildlife and in the protection of the natural environment, thereby contributing towards Council's objectives of achieving both an improved quality of life and sustainable future.


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| Resolutions 7/13, 8/13 and 9/13 |
